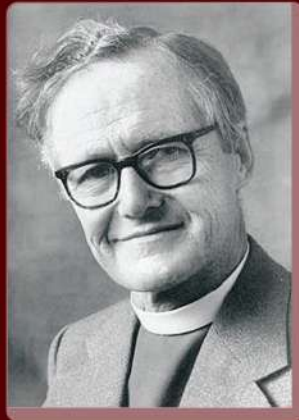

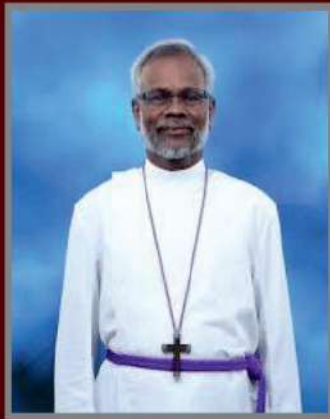

**A BRIEF HISTORY OF
CSI BISHOP NEWBIGIN COLLEGE OF
EDUCATION**

The Church of South India, Diocese of Madras is running more than 250 institutions established by the Christian Missionaries before 150 years. These institutions are serving the downtrodden and economically poor in society. Based on the dire need to provide job-oriented course and to train teachers to serve in more than 200 schools of the Diocese, a College of Education in memory of former Bishop Rt. Rev. Dr. LESSLIE NEWBIGIN was established at CSI St. Ebba's Higher Secondary School Campus, Mylapore, Chennai - 600 004, Tamilnadu during the academic year 2009-2010.

By the Grace of God our college has been blessed several folds by the leadership of our beloved Bishop the Chairman of the college.

We are Christian religious minority with the right to establish and administer educational institutions. The establishment of B.Ed. College is urgently needed to train teachers to work in the institutions run by the CSI Diocese of Madras.

This co-educational B.Ed College will cater to the needs of young graduates and post graduates to get employment in the field of education.

Foundation of the College

Bishop Lesslie Newbiggin served the Diocese of Madras from 1965-1975. In view of his birth centenary which falls in the year 2009, the institution is named after him as a sign of honour to Bishop Newbiggin and an expression of gratitude to God. CSI Bishop Newbiggin College of Education is established by the CSI Diocese of Madras from 2009-2010 (NCTE No. F.NO.SRC/NCTE/APS09200/B.Ed./TN/2023/143668-143672 Date:23.10.2023) and affiliated to (NO.TNTEU/R/Cont.Affln./2021/Date:2.12.2021) and has its office in Chennai. It is approved by NCTE No. F.NO.SRC/NCTE/APS09200/B.Ed./TN/2023/143668-143672 Date:23.10.2023 and affiliated to Tamilnadu Teachers Education University No. NO.TNTEU/R/Cont.Affln./2021/Date:2.12.2021. In accordance with the new NCTE rules and Regulations 2014, the total intake of B.Ed., students is 100 (2 basic unit of 50 each)

Goals and Objectives :

1. To inculcate Christian values among Teacher Trainees to meet the challenges of the changing world.
2. To equip the Teacher Trainees with excellent pedagogical skills.
3. To transform Teacher Trainees to function effectively as role models of the Great Teacher.

Admission Procedure :

Both male and female candidates with the following marks in the Bachelor's degree are eligible for admissions to the programme other than Economics and Commerce for which PG qualification will be mandatory. B.E., M.E., Graduates are also eligible for B.Ed. admissions to do Mathematics, Physical Science and Biological Science as their Pedagogic subjects.

Level - II is pertaining to standard IX and X for undergraduate qualified student teacher and standard XI and XII for post graduate qualified student-teachers. the student-teachers need to get an overview of their pedagogy subject prescribed in the school teacher curriculum and also to teach their concerned pedagogic subject at Level-II during the school internship.

Note 2 : Enhancing Professional capacities (EPC) records are to be prepared and submitted at the time of practical examination. The EPC records are to be prepared based on the theoretical input and practical experiences gained from reading and reflecting on text, performance in drama and art related to teaching and learning process, and understanding of the strength and weaknesses of one's own self.
